Rapid Response Vehicle Appeal

The Air Ambulance Service has long been recognised as essential to modern life, and worthy of the support of Lions. Since 2012, Lions Clubs across Kent, Surrey and Sussex have donated to Air Ambulance Kent Surrey and Sussex (AAKSS) over £315,000 for the following:

- (a) to enable the development of a fully functional night flying service
- (b) to provide two rapid response vehicles
- (c) to provide a head scanner to be developed for in-aircraft use, and
- (d) to equip the aircraft and emergency cars with eight video laryngoscopes



There is now a delay in our support for the head scanner project, whilst ethical approvals are obtained and patient trials are carried out. While we wait, we have had a further request from AAKSS



The two rapid response vehicles we previously provided, and which proudly carry the Lions logo, have been of immense benefit to AAKSS and its patients right across our District. However, because of their heavy use, it is becoming more and more difficult and expensive to keep their performance to the high standard required by the service. Therefore, AAKSS have asked us if we can provide another vehicle to join their vehicle fleet, so that they can maintain the standard and frequency of service required of them. AAKSS can obtain a suitable vehicle, tuned for high performance and kitted out for their needs, for a heavily discounted total price of £42,500. More details are available on request. **Please give generously** so that we can provide this essential vehicle as quickly as possible, and thus enable AAKSS **to save more lives.**
